PURPOSE OF FORMING AN AUXILIARY**

Dear reader,

This journal was discovered in a closet, in a cardboard box, at the Post in April 2010 by Kathy Wiker, Treasurer; Susan Ellis, Sr. Vice President and trustee; Janet Getz, District 9 Sr. Vice President and auxiliary trustee.

As this is a part of our auxiliary's history, and the original journal is now nearly 65 years old, we made the decision to transcribe this gem into modern day format. Susan Ellis transcribed the original notes, Kathy Wiker printed the text. We then made an extra copy to lend out to anyone who might want to read it. These new text files are saved on a flash drive in Word 97 format.

When we found the book we also found a Ladies Auxiliary cap with PENNSYLVANIA on one side and the Ladies Auxiliary crest and 1463 on the other side. We will search for ways to preserve the original journal and the cap.

The text was transcribed as close to the original as possible. A change of secretary meant a change in writing style and penmanship. There are some blanks and typist's notes. Age has yellowed the pages a bit and blurred some of the original ink writing. Strikeouts and misspellings were transcribed as written. There were terms I was not familiar with but included as written (i.e. one-pound social, merchandise club, paper demonstration, etc). There is mention of our current day "piggie", known at that time as "Pig Prize" along with description of the prize; the "pig" has existed almost from day one. You'll see Scotland School, Coatesville projects, National Home, hospital funds, price for dues, cost of goods, the forerunner of our "meat trays" where they sold turkeys and ducks and.....uniforms! District meetings, encampments and various trips are noted.

It was my pleasure to transcribe these notes. I was almost sad to see the end of the book, I wanted to know more.

If you know any member, current or past, who might remember some of these Auxiliary members or the activities, please let us know. If they have any memorabilia from our Auxiliary, we would love to see that as well.

I hope you enjoy reading this little bit of history.

A meeting was called to order by Staff Officer Mrs. Mary Kramer, of the Department of Pennsylvania, Ladies Auxiliaries to the Veterans of Foreign Wars with Mrs. Blanche Banesky, Dept. Hospital Assistant acting as Secretary, with ten ladies present.

This meeting was called for the purpose of forming an Auxiliary, the necessary fifteen names had been sent into the Department with check, by the Post, which money had been collected from the persons who signified willingness to join the aux.

Mrs. Kramer explained the principles of our organization and what it stands for, eligibility and some of the work in which we are interested. Also Scotland School.

Mrs. Blanche Banesky next spoke on the Hospital work, and the National Home.

Mrs. Kramer next explained the charter would remain open for ninety days, and that the dues were not to be less than \$1.50 per year, but in as much as a half year had elapsed, each member would now only have to pay a half years dues.

The donation to the Health and Happiness Fund was explained and suggestion made that this 50 cents per member be added to the dues, which eliminate any trouble in accumulating this fund in the future, in as much as this Fund was due and payable on the membership as of July 31, 1946, at the rate of 50 cents per member.

A recess was declared so those present could discuss this matter and also decide on tentative officers, which selection would have to be ratified by those present at the next meeting before election would take place.

Recess. Meeting called to order.

It was the unanimous opinion of those present that the 50 cents per member be added to the dues, as suggested.

Mrs. Margaret B. Perry who had completed cards, one of the ladies was going to decide by the next meeting.

It was decided to ask Mrs. Lillian Witeven, Past President of the Third District of the Dept. of Penna. And the Patriotic Instructor to act as Instituting Officer.

Mrs. Kramer, reported that the Dept. Treasure had returned the \$2.50 which had been sent for the Band with the Charter fee, as this would not be due until August on account of the expiration of the present Bonds as of August.

Acting Secretary, Sr. Banesky cast the unanimous vote duly electing the selection as ratified after which she installed those present into office.

Sr. Kramer, instituting officer and Past President next presented to the newly elected President the Black Bible to be used on the Altar at regular meetings. Sr. Witiver Dept. Patriotic Instructor and instituting officer presented a White Bible to be used for Memorial Services. Sr. Katie Lewis, President of the Cocalic Valley Auxiliary 3376 of Ephrata presented the President with four color bearer flags as a gift from her auxiliary.

Next followed a few words from Sr. Banesky as Dept. Hospital Chairman, explaining requests would be received from time to time for donations for the Welfare of the Veteran and his family which money would be given from the "Welfare Fund" which must be kept separate, from the regular fund and used only for this relief work. To start this fund she donated \$5.00 on behalf of Comrade Banesky and herself.

The President, Sr. Perry responded to these gifts and thanked the donors for their kindness.

Since the Commander of the Post with several other Comrades were present to witness the induction of this Auxiliary, each was asked for a few words.

National Aide de Camp Banesky was present and extended the greeting of the National Commander for success of this new Auxiliary. He spoke on membership and also the advantages offered the Veterans by the Service Officer provided for them by the Post.

Next the Commander spoke and extended greetings, offering all the support and cooperation of the Auxiliary needed, which was in itself the first step in a firm foundation. Not all Auxiliaries are given the welcome this commander extended to you.

At this time the Comrades left the meeting, and the regular routine of business was explained with the reading and approval of the minutes of the previous meeting.

The Sisters present had decided on the dues to be \$1.50 per year, payable in advance. In as much as six months had already passed it would only be necessary now to pay a half year's dues to which was added the regular donation to Health and Happiness Fund which is paid for the National Home of 50 cents making the total due at this meeting of \$1.25.

It was decided to hold meetings second and fourth Tuesday to keep up the interest and the first meeting was scheduled on August 8, 1946.

The meeting was turned back to the President who opened same according to ritual, and standing a moment in silent respect to departed sisters and comrades.

Reading and approval of the minutes of the previous meeting.

Guests were admitted from Cocalico Valley Auxiliary 3376 of Ephrata, and Sr. Lillian Witiver, the instituting officer was extended welcome.

Sr. Betty Kellen, was appointed Rehabilitation Chairman. It is her duty to send cards, flowers, fruit, etc. to the sick auxiliary members, Post members, or any other Veteran who may need assistance if so ordered by the President

Under suggestions for the good of the order Sr. Mary Kramer Deputy Chief of Staff spoke on the message given at the Encampment from our National President, who spoke on membership. She commended the Srs. On their interest in their Auxiliary and extended her best wishes.

Under suggestions for the good of the order Sr. Bonesky suggested that the President of the Auxiliary send a card to each Gold Star Mother, on Sept. 29 which is being set aside for them.

Sr. Hartenstine suggested we each bring gum, cigars, life savers, candy bars, along to the meeting and save them and them to the Veterans Hospitals.

Sr. Leed suggested that if it can be arranged we have a refreshment stand at the Bingo Parties. Sr. Zug was appointed Chairman, and to report at the next meeting.
