Thanks to all who renewed their 2010 dues before the cutoff date. As you know, membership is not a right, it is a privilege. Renewing on time guaranteed that privilege. For those who did not renew, your membership number has been assigned to a new patron member. Former patron members who choose to renew their membership after January 1, 2010 must start at the beginning by applying for a new membership. Dues for former members are \$30. Twenty (\$20) for membership and ten (\$10) for a new key card. **Membership is not guaranteed but based on availability.**

Thank you for your cooperation observing the rules of the club. **One rule, that applies to all of us, is that you must have on your person your signed 2010-membership card whenever you are on the premises. Veterans News

Bad News: We are all aware of the circus in Harrisburg called “passing the budget”. After months of negotiations the veterans of Pennsylvania were targeted and benefits veterans had for many years were sacrificed for political greed. Two important programs were cut. Operations at the Scotland School for veteran’s children were suspended. The Commonwealth established this school in 1895 when all facilities for Civil War veteran’s children were consolidated on this site. The school has been a success with many of the graduates going on to college or to enter the military. The second slap in the veteran’s faces was the closing of five Governor’s Veterans Outreach and Assistance Centers. The federally funded, 29-year-old program has offices in Harrisburg, Boyertown, Erie, Greensburg, and West Pittston. These centers helped predominantly older veterans who reside in rural areas apply for disability compensation, pensions and health care. Many are older veterans who fought in World War II or the Korean War. Because of their age and immobility they require personal assistance to obtain benefits they are entitled to. Now the bureaucrats have taken this personal service away from them. With the current conflicts raging in Iraq and Afghanistan is this the right time to reduce established veterans programs? I don’t know about you but I’m angry about the veteran’s budget being cut whenever money is short. The only things the politicians pay attention to are the cash rich special interest groups or **ANGRY VOTERS!** Tell them that if they continue to reduce the veteran’s budget then maybe, they will find themselves out of a job. I urge all of you to unite and speak out in a loud and clear voice. I intend to let our state representative and senators know how I feel and I urge you to do the same!

Good News: I read in the newspaper about a special veteran benefit titled **“Aid and Attendance Pension”**. According to the article it is a pension that is not dependent upon service related injuries. To be eligible the applicant must have an honorable discharge, be a wartime veteran with 90 days of active service, with 1 day beginning or ending in a period of war. The veteran must be disabled, blind or in need of care. The surviving spouse of the veteran may also apply for this benefit. More information is available online at: www.vba.va.gov/bln/21/pension.
